

Jack Holmgren brought in the model of the month. The Goldberg Extra 300 was modified and scratch built by Bernie Liskov. It has a 4" longer WS and it uses a full depth spar with cap spars developed by Ed Avena. The wing is fully sheeted and the stabilizer/elevator was enlarged, made with an airfoil and sheeted. The resulting aircraft is very light. Jack completed the radio installation, assembled and covered the model.

Power is by OS 1.20 4C and that should be adequate to power this aircraft very nicely.

MINUTES OF MARCH 21, 2006 MEETING

The March 21, 2006 meeting of the RC Prophusters was called to order at 7:00 PM with 22 members present. The minutes of the January meeting were read by Bernie Liskov and accepted as read. The treasurers' monthly report was read by Ron Czikowsky is as follows. For the month of February the opening balance was \$10,322.22. Income was \$295.00, donations were \$60.00 and expenses were \$300.00. The ending balance was \$10,316.22. The report was accepted as read.

REPORTS:

There were no reports on the Henry Struck and Bob Beringer events. Eric Ehrenfels and Eric Anderson asked that the Helicopter fly-in date be moved to Sept. 16 and 17 because of a conflict with another helicopter event. A motion was made and passed to move the date.

Jack Holmgren reported that he met with Andy Argenio on March 13 at our flying field. He liked our field and at that time he suggested to Jack the following dates: July 7, 8, and 9. July 14, 15, and 16. August 18, 19, and 20. August 25, 26, and 27. The problem with those dates is whether the hay would be mowed for parking.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Concerning hosting an AMA event this year, Jack Holmgren introduced Andy Argenio, District VP, and Ed Ferrier and Les Watson. Andy spoke for a half hour and talked about having an AMA District event at our field this year. One of his goals is to bring about a feeling of camaraderie between all R/C fliers. Although we would not be able to charge landing fees, we would receive between \$300.00 and \$800.00 for hosting the event. We can have 50/50 raffles, raffles for kits etc, food sales, and can charge rent for vendors or ask for parking donations.

The AMA is sponsoring 2 events this year. One will be an open event for all aspects of general R/C aviation. The other will be a specific type event as in warbird, float fly, turbine, soaring, etc. And the open event will also include control line flying. There are 35 clubs in CT. and 31 in MA. But we are not sure of what the draw would be. The Gardner, MA event last year was a big success. Andy has gentlemen who will videotape the event for posterity. We would have to provide an impound area for the transmitters and a PA system (which we already have), and we would have to implement a system of self inspection of all planes which will fly. Andy has the inspection forms that we can copy. We would also have a static display area and can give out awards for various categories. The event will be advertised in the AMA newsletter and free AMA hats and Tee shirts will be given to club officers as well as paying for dinner for the officers.

District 1 will have an AMA meeting during the event that will allow the general membership to see how business is conducted at an AMA meeting.

The dates that Andy said were available are June 9-11, July 7-9, August 18-20, August 25-27, September 8-10, and September 22-24. Also it is likely that there would be noontime entertainment such as John Glezellis or others doing a demonstration flight. Groups of similar types of airplanes would be encouraged to fly together. Spotters would be required and marshals would be assigned to specific tasks. Donators of merchandise would receive free advertising. At the end of Andy's talk a motion was made and seconded to allow this event to be held at our field. The motion was passed. Although the CD will be one of Andy's friends, George Citron will represent the Propbusters as the event coordinator and will have a committee of 5 to help. Tom Vernon and Jack Holmgren will talk to Stu Gadbois about using the field behind the flying area for parking as it is likely that the hay will already be cut by then.

In other unfinished business, Jack showed various embroidered patches for the jackets. George bought 3 models from H&H Hobbies and asked for the club to pay for them with an additional \$30.00 for construction costs. These models are worth much more than \$100.00 and they will be assembled and raffled off at the Henry Struck Electric Fly-in. A motion was made, seconded and passed to have the club pay for them.

3 gentlemen from the Rocket Society came to the meeting to ask if they could have another rocket event at our field this year and would we like to do a demonstration of R/C flying while they are at the field? The date they asked for is May 6. A motion was made seconded and passed to allow this. The hours are to be 9:00 AM to 12:00 noon.

MODEL OF THE MONTH

Jack Holmgren brought a modified Goldberg Extra 300. This plane has wings that are 4" longer than standard and the wing is fully sheeted and is built in the same way that Ed Avena builds all of his built up pattern ship wings, with a continuous shear web and notched ribs. The horizontal stab is an airfoil shape and all of the control surfaces are oversize. The plane is built very light as well. Jack won, as it was the only plane there.

NEW BUSINESS:

Dennis Duplice reminded that the spring cleanup dates is April 22. It was noted that the field is in excellent shape and will not need much work. Bring cheap paintbrushes to waterproof the tables and reels.
